	This new draft provides for the State to pay 10%
	of the group accident and sickness or health insur-
	ance on behalf of eligible retired teachers. The
	State presently provides, without cost, group acci-
	dent and sickness or health insurance on behalf of
	retired state employees. Teachers are considered to
	be state employees for retirement purposes. The eli-
	gibility requirements for participation in the group
	accident and sickness or health plan by retired
	teachers shall be the same requirements as those gov-
•	erning the teacher as an active teacher.

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
