NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Clarify the Definition and
Application of Active State Service in
the Defense Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
follows:

Sec. 1. 37-B MRSA §101-A is enacted to read:

§101-A. Definitions

1. Active state service. As used in this Title,
"active state service" means all military duty per-
formed as a member of the state military forces in a
pay status described in section 143 by order of the
Governor under this Title or performed under the
United States Code, Title 32.

1 2. Military forces. "Military forces" means the
2 state military forces, as defined in section 102.

3 Sec. 2. 37-B MRSA §402, sub-§§2 and 6, as en-
4 acted by PL 1983, c. 460, §3, are repealed and the
5 following enacted in its place:

6 2. Active service. Active service is defined in
7 section 101-A, subsection 1.

8 6. Military forces. Military forces is defined
9 in section 101-A, subsection 2.

STATEMENT OF FACT

11 The new draft clarifies that the definitions of
12 active state service and military forces are general
13 definitions and not just definitions applicable to
14 the Maine Code of Military Justice.
