solicit a voter's signature until the voter has completed voting. The warden may direct the removal, under subsection 2, paragraph A, of any person collecting signatures who does not comply with the requirements of this subsection.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

7 This new draft provides guidelines for local election wardens to ensure that the collection of pe-8 9 tition signatures does not interfere with orderly voting, while at the same time providing protection 10 of the constitutional rights of petitioners. The war-11 12 den may select and designate a specific place for the collection to proceed, but that location must be ac-13 cessible to voters and voters must be able to readily 14 15 observe the persons collecting signatures. The warden 16 may limit the number of people gathering signatures 17 to just one person for each specific question, candidate or issue. The people collecting signatures can-18 19 not ask a voter to sign the petition until after that 20 voter has voted. The warden may have any person violating this section removed from the voting place. 21
