STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Abolish and to Reorganize Certain Portions of the Department of the Secretary of State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Reorganization; Department of the Secretary of State. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or any rule, the Secretary of State, on the effective date of this Act, shall reorganize the Department of the Secretary of State by abolishing the position of Deputy Secretary of State in charge of public administration and by transferring all functions and duties under that deputy, including, but not limited to, the following bureaus, to such other departments and agencies as the Secretary of State may direct, subject to the approval of the Legislative Council:

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
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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require the Secretary of State to abolish the position of deputy in charge of public administration and to reorganize certain parts of the Department of the Secretary of State, subject to approval of the Legislative Council.

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
