STATEMENT OF FACT

as a nontraditional, limited purpose school shall not alter that institution's current status for the purpose of state or local taxation.

This new draft provides the Department of Educational and Cultural Services with a process for approval of nontraditional, limited purpose schools not covered by existing law.

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
