IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Establishing the Commission to Study the Impact of Game and Nongame Species on Maine's Economy.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

1. Study. There is established the Commission to Study the Impact of Game and Nongame Species on Maine's Economy, which shall consist of 9 members to be appointed as follows: Two members of the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs; 2 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation; 2 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Fisheries and Wildlife, to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the

House; and 3 members appointed by the Governor. The commission shall elect a chairman from among its members.

All appointments shall be made no later than 10 days following the effective date of this Act. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall be notified by all appointing authorities once their selections have been finalized.

9 The first meeting of the commission shall be con-10 vened by the Chairman of the Legislative Council.

11 Compensation. The legislative members of Sec. 2. 12 the commission shall receive the legislative per di-13 em, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2. Legislators shall not be paid a per di-14 15 em when they attend meetings of the commission while 16 the Legislature is in session or in conjunction with 17 serving on another board for which they receive com-18 pensation. All members of the commission shall be re-19 imbursed for expenses upon application to the Execu-20 tive Director of the Legislative Council.

21 Sec. 3. Duties and responsibilities. The commis-22 sion shall study the impact of game and nongame spe-23 cies on Maine's economy, including, but not limited 24 to:

A. An analysis of the present economic impact of
the State's wildlife resources on Maine's econo my;

B. An analysis of the economic, recreational and
ecological potential of the State's wildlife re sources on Maine's economy;

C. An analysis of the annual costs associated
with managing and maximizing the potential of
these resources for the long-term benefit of the
entire State; and

35 D. An evaluation of alternative funding mecha-36 nisms for managing these resources.

37 Sec. 4. Staff. Staffing assistance for the commission shall be requested from the Legislative Council.

Sec. 5. Report. The commission shall report its findings and recommendations, including any implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature by February 1, 1988.

Sec. 6. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
