9 amendment establishes an interim assistance The 10 payment program utilizing General Fund dollars. This 11 program, currently allowed under the United States 12 Social Security Administration policy 13 implemented in this State, will be available, upon 14 state hospital discharge, to United States Supplemental Security Income recipients whose benefits have been terminated after a 90-day hospitalization to be used for meeting basic food, clothing and housing needs until United States Supplemental Security Income 15 16 17 18 19 payments are resumed.

The required agreement with the United States
Social Security Administration will be implemented by
the Department of Human Services. The Department of
Mental Health and Mental Retardation will administer
the program at each hospital.

The amendment appropriates \$10,000 so that United States Supplemental Security Income recipients will continue to receive the equivalent of United States Supplemental Security Income benefits, \$364 per month, for a maximum of 3 additional months while hospitalized, but only if such funds are required to maintain housing in the community.

The amendment also appropriates \$46,404 for interim assistance payments to individuals who were mentally impaired, then found no longer mentally impaired, but who then suffer a relapse.
