AN ACT to Continue Insurance Coverage for Mental Health, Alcohol and Substance Abuse Treatment Services for Maine Citizens.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This new draft repeals the expiration date of the 3 State's laws establishing insurance coverage for 4 treatment of mental illness and alcohol and substance 5 abuse, enacted by the Legislature in 1983, as did the 6 original bill.

7 The new new draft also keeps the provisions from 8 the original bill which require mandated benefits to 9 be available as of the annual renewal date and be ap-10 plicable to certificates issued in the State by out-11 of-state companies.

12 The establishment of the Mandated Benefits Advis-13 Commission is retained from the original bill. ory 14 The structure and appointment process have been modi-15 fied in this new draft. A11 members will be ap-16 pointed by the Governor. Membership has been ex-17 panded to better represent all interested parties.

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
