## HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1235, L.D. 1687

## 1 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment makes 2 changes to clarify the 3 language of the resolve. First, the suit concerning liability and damages attributable to the State 4 and Cumberland County will be governed by the same 5 laws which apply to litigation between individuals. Second, the resolve is clarified to make sure that the liability and defenses of state and county em-6 7 8 9 ployees as defined by the Maine Tort Claims Act are 10 affected by the resolve, despite the fact that 11 the immunity of the State and county is waived. 12 the aggregate amount of damages has been made 13 the same as the maximum amount allowed under the Maine Tort Claims Act when there is insurance cover-14 15 age.
