continue to be governed by the Maine Tort Claims Act,

the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 14, chapter 741.'

HOUSE AMENDMENT "" to H.P. 1235, L.D. 1687

1 STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This amendment makes 2 changes to clarify the 3 language of the resolve. First, the suit concerning 4 the liability and damages attributable to the State 5 and Cumberland County will be governed by the same 6 laws which apply to litigation between individuals. Second, the resolve is clarified to make sure that 7 the liability and defenses of state and county em-8 ployees as defined by the Maine Tort Claims Act are 9 not affected by the resolve, despite the fact that 10 the immunity of the State and county is waived. 11 12 Third, the amendment limits recovery to \$50,000 in 13 the aggregate, except when there is insurance cover-14 age, in which case, recovery against a governmental 15 entity which is insured shall not exceed the amount 16 of any insurance coverage.
