Resolved: That the county commissioners of Washington County are authorized to borrow any portion of the sums authorized in this Part from or through any agency or department of the State and of the Federal Government. The county commissioners are authorized to receive grants of money and other assistance from or through any agency or department of the State and of the Federal Government for any of the purposes authorized in this Part; and be it further

14 Bonds. Sec. 3. Resolved: That, to provide funds for expenses related to the renovation and con-15 16 struction of the jail, the treasurer of Washington County, with the approval of the county commission-17 18 ers, may borrow from time to time upon the full faith 19 credit of the county such sums not exceeding in 20 the aggregate \$350,000 as may be necessary 21 issue self-liquidating bonds therefor which shall 22 bear on their face the words "Washington County Capi-23 tal Improvement Bonds Act of 1987." Each authorized 24 shall be payable in such annual installments, beginning not more than 2 years from the date thereof 25 26 and not earlier than the year 1989, as will extinguish each loan in not more than 20 years from its 27 28 The bonds shall be signed by the treasurer 29 the county and countersigned by the chairman of the 30 county commissioners. This is the regular yearly resolve for the laying of taxes in Washington County. In addition, it provides for an authorization to raise \$350,000 to cover expenses associated with jail renovations and construction.

In 1984, a bond issue for \$1.4 million was authorized by the Legislature and the county voters for renovation and additions to the Washington County jail. Subsequently, the lowest bid received was for \$2.1 million. Therefore, in 1986, the Legislature authorized an additional \$700,000 in funding. In order to obtain badly needed space quickly and to be able to accept the bid within the specified time period, the resolve authorizing this money removed the need for the normal voter referendum.

Construction was begun in 1986 and \$338,000 in additional expenses were incurred and will be in-

To place these expenses in the county budget 15 16 would have resulted in a 48% increase. Therefore, 17 the decision was made to borrow the necessary funds by adding to the current bond issue and this resolve 18 19 requests \$350,000 for this purpose. This will raise the total authorized funding for the jail construc-20 21 There is currently an agreement tion to \$2,450,000. 22 with the Farmers Home Administration for 20-year 23 bonds at a 5% rate of interest. This is the county's 24 only bonded indebtedness and this indebtedness with 25 interest will total \$3,932,260.

27 temporary notes have already been issued 28 against the original bond authorization and because 29 permanent financing cannot be obtained until construction is completed, it is not felt feasible to 30 31 make this additional funding contingent on the normal 32 voter referendum. Therefore, this resolve removes that requirement.
