Amend the bill in subsection 3 in paragraph D in
the 2nd line (page 3, line 9 in L.D.) by striking out
the following: "20,000 persons or less:" and insert-
ing in its place the following: '7,501 to 20,000 per-
sons:'

at the end the following:

'E. In municipalities having a population of
5,000 persons or less:

(1) Year-round qualified catering services
must have a minimum gross income of \$5,000 a
year from the sale of food to the public;

(2) Part-time qualified catering services
must have a minimum gross income of \$2,500
from the sale of food to the public as a re-
quirement for a part-time license not in ex-
cess of 6 consecutive months.'
