IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Clarify the Organizational Status of the Bureau of Lottery within the Department of Finance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 8 MRSA c. 14, as amended, is repealed.

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Sec. 2. 8 MRSA c. 14-A is enacted to read:

CHAPTER 14-A

LOTTERY

§371. Definitions

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1	As used in this chapter, unless the context indi-
2	cates otherwise, the following terms have the follow-
3	ing meanings.
4	1. Bureau. "Bureau" means the Bureau of Lottery
5	within the Department of Finance to carry out the
6	purposes of this chapter.
7	2. Commission. "Commission" means the State
8	Lottery Commission.
9	<u>3. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Com-</u>
10	missioner of Finance.
11 12	4. Director. "Director" means the State Lottery Director.
13	5. Person. "Person" means an individual, asso-
14	ciation, corporation, club, trust, estate, society,
15	company, receiver, trustee, assignee, referee or oth-
16	er person acting in a fiduciary or representative ca-
17	pacity, whether appointed by a court or otherwise,
18	and any combination of individuals. "Person" means
19	all departments, commissions, agencies and instrumen-
20	talities of the State, including counties and munici-
21	palities and agencies and instrumentalities thereof.
22	§372. Director
23	The executive head of the bureau shall be the di-
24	rector.
25	1. Appointment; qualifications. The director
26	must be a person qualified by training and experience
27	to direct the state lotteries. The director shall be
28	appointed by the commissioner, to be under his imme-
29	diate supervision, direction and control, and shall
30	serve at the pleasure of the commissioner. Any va-
31	cancy occurring in the office of the director shall
32	be filled in the same manner as the original appoint-
33	ment. The director shall devote his entire time and
34	attention to the duties of his office.
35 36	2. Powers and duties. The director shall have the following powers and duties:

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A. Supervise the operation of lotteries in accordance with this chapter and with the rules promulgated under this chapter;

B. Act as the chief administrative officer, having general charge of the office and records and to employ such personnel as may be necessary to fulfill the purposes of this chapter. The personnel shall be employed with the approval of the commissioner and subject to the Civil Service Law, except for the deputy director who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the director;

C. Act as executive secretary of the commission;

D. In accordance with this chapter and the rules promulgated under this chapter, license as agents to sell lottery tickets such persons who, in his opinion, will best serve the public convenience and promote the sale of tickets or shares. The director may require a bond from every licensed agent in such amount as provided by rule. Every licensed agent shall prominently display his license, or a copy of his license, as provided by rule;

E. Confer regularly as necessary or desirable and not less than once each month with the commissioner on the operation and administration of the lotteries; make available for inspection by the commissioner, upon request, all books, records, files and other information and documents of the commission; advise the commissioner and recommend such matters as he deems necessary and advisable to improve the operation and administration of the lotteries;

F. Recommend to the commission that it suspend or revoke, in accordance with section 376, any license issued pursuant to this chapter or the rules promulgated under this chapter;

G. Subject to the approval of the commissioner and to any applicable laws relating to public contracts, enter into contracts for the operation of the lotteries, or any part of the lotteries,

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1	and into contracts for the promotion of the lot-
2	teries. All contracts shall be awarded to the
3	lowest responsible bidder and shall be let for a
4	period not to exceed 3 years. No contract
5	awarded or entered into by the director may be
6	assigned by the holder of the contract, except by
7	specific approval of the commissioner;
8	H. Certify monthly to the Treasurer of State,
9	the commission and the commissioner a full and
10	complete statement of lottery revenues, prize
11	disbursements and other expenses for the preced-
12	ing month; submit an annual report, through the
13	commissioner and with his approval, which shall
14	include a full and complete statement of lottery
15	revenues, prize disbursements and expenses, to
16	the Governor and the Legislature, together with
17	recommendations for changes in this chapter; and
18	I. Carry on a continuous study and investigation
19	of the lotteries throughout the State and the op-
20	eration and administration of similar laws which
21	may be in effect in other states or countries.
22	§373. State Lottery Commission
23	The State Lottery Commission, established by Ti-
24	tle 5, section 12004, subsection 8, shall consist of
25	5 members, all of whom must be citizens and residents
26	of this State and shall be appointed by the Governor,
27	and shall be subject to review by the joint standing
28	committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
29	legal affairs and confirmation by the Senate. No
30	more than 3 of the 5 members may be members of the
31	same political party. The members shall annually
32	elect one of them as chairman of the commission.
33	Any vacancy in the commission, occurring for any
34	reason other than the expiration of term, shall be
35	filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as
36	the original appointment.
37	The members of the commission shall receive no
38	salaries and shall be compensated as provided in Ti-
39	tle 5, chapter 379. In addition, the commission mem-
40	bers shall not be compensated for more than 20 meet-

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§374. Commission; powers and duties

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The commission shall meet with the director, not 2 less than once each month, to promulgate and amend 3 4 rules, subject to the approval of the commissioner, 5 relating to the lotteries; to make recommendations 6 and set policy for state lotteries and to transact 7 other business that may be properly brought before 8 the commission. Rules adopted by the commission 9 shall be adopted in a manner consistent with the 10 Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 11 375. 12 Rules. The rules promulgated by the commis-13 sion shall include, but not be limited to: 14 A. The types of lotteries to be conducted; 15 B. The price of tickets or shares in the lotter-16 ies; 17 C. 15	als; for the repayment of the money appropriated
16	to the State Lottery Fund; and for transfer to

No action of the com- mission is binding unless taken at a meeting at which at least 3 of the 5 members are present and vote in favor of the action. The minutes of every meeting of the commission, including any rules promulgated by the commission or any amendments, revisions, supple- ments or repeals, shall be immediately transmitted, by and under the certification of the secretary, to the commissioner for his approval or disapproval and to the Governor.
29 30 31 32 33	3. Limintation of authority. The commission and the bureau shall have no authority to regulate, con- trol or otherwise supervise the operation or conduct of the amusement commonly known as "beano" or "bingo," as defined in Title 17, section 311.
34	§375. Lottery sales agent; licensing
35	1. Factors. A license as an agent to sell lot-
36	tery tickets or shares may be issued by the director
37	to any qualified person. Before issuing the license,
38	the director shall consider such factors as:
39 40	A. The financial responsibility and security of the person and his business or activity;

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B. The accessibility of his place of business or activity to the public;

C. The sufficiency of existing licensees to serve the public convenience; and

D. The volume of expected sales.

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§376. Suspension and revocation of licenses

1. The commission may suspend or revoke, after notice and hearing, any license issued pursuant to this chapter. The license may be temporarily suspended by the commission without prior notice, pending any prosecution, investigation or hearing. A license may be suspended or revoked by the commission for just cause, including one or more of the following reasons:

A. Failure to account for tickets received or the proceeds of the sale of tickets or to file a bond, if required by the commission, or to comply with instructions of the commission concerning the licensed activity;

B. Conviction of any criminal offense;

C. Failure to file any return or report, to keep records or to pay any tax;

D. Engaging in fraud, deceit, misrepresentation or conduct prejudicial to public confidence;

E. Insufficiency of the number of tickets sold by the sales agent; or

F. A material change, since issuance of the license, with respect to any of the matters required to be considered by the director under section 375.

2. Suspension; state license. Except in the case of suspension or revocation for the reasons set forth in section 412, subsection 1, paragraph E or F, any suspension or revocation of a tri-state license issued under chapter 16 shall automatically result in suspension of the state license.

2 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, anv 3 person licensed as provided in this chapter may act 4 as a lottery sales agent. 5 §378. Assignment of prizes No right of any person to a prize drawn may 6 be 7 assignable, except that payment of any prize drawn 8 may be paid to the estate of a deceased prize winner, and except that any person pursuant to an appropriate judicial order may be paid the prize to which the 9 10 winner is entitled. The bureau shall be discharged 11 12 of all further liability upon payment of a prize pur-13 suant to this section. 14 §379. Sales above fixed price; unlicensed sales; 15 gifts 16 No person may sell a ticket or share at a price 17 greater than that fixed by rule of the commission. No person other than a licensed lottery sales agent may sell lottery tickets or shares, except that noth-18 19 20 ing in this section prevents any person from giving 21 lottery tickets or shares to another as a gift. 22 Any person who violates this section commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more 23 than \$200 may be adjudged. 24 25 §380. Sales to persons under 18 years; gifts No ticket or share may be sold to any person un-der the age of 18 years, but this shall not be deemed 26 27 28 to prohibit the purchase of a ticket or share for the purpose of making a gift by a person 18 years of 29 age or older to a person less than that age. Any licens-ee who knowingly sells or offers to sell a lottery 30 31 32 ticket or share to any person under the age of 18 33 commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than \$200 may be adjudged. 34 3.5 §381. Persons prohibited from purchasing tickets or 36 shares

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No ticket or share may be purchased by, and no prize may be paid to, any of the following persons: Any officer or employee of the commission or bureau or any spouse, child, brother, sister or parent residing as a member of the same household in the principal place of abode of any of these persons.

§382. Unclaimed prize money

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Unclaimed prize money for the prize on a winning ticket or share shall be retained by the director for the person entitled to it for one year after the drawing in which the prize was won. If no claim is made for the money within that year, the prize money shall be reallocated as prizes in the form of special promotions.

§383. Deposit of receipts; reports

The director may require any lottery sales agents to deposit to the credit of the State Lottery Fund in banks designated by the Treasurer of State all money received by the agents from the sale of lottery tickets or shares, less the amount, if any, retained as compensation for the sale of tickets or shares and to file with the director or his designated agents reports of their receipts and transactions in the sale of lottery tickets in such form and containing such information as he may require. The director may make such arrangements for any person, including a bank, to perform the functions, activities or services in connection with the operation of the lottery as he may deem advisable pursuant to this chapter and the rules of the commission and those functions, activities or services shall constitute lawful functions, activities and services of that person.

§385. Persons under 18 years; payment of prizes

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1 If the person entitled to a prize or any winning 2 ticket is under the age of 18 years and the prize is less than \$5,000, the director may direct payment the prize by delivery of a check or draft payable 3 of 4 to 5 the order of the minor to an adult member of the 6 minor's family or a guardian of the minor. If the 7 person entitled to a prize or any ticket is under the age of 18 years and the prize is \$5,000 or more, the 8 9 director may direct payment to the minor by depositing the amount of the prize in any bank to the credit of an adult member of the minor's family or guardian as custodian for the minor. The person named as cus-10 11 12 todian has the same duties and powers as a person 13 designated as a custodian in a manner prescribed by 14 the "Maine Uniform Gifts to Minors Act." For pur-poses of this section, the terms "adult member of a minor's family," "guardian of a minor" and "bank" 15 16 17 shall have the same meanings as set out in that Act. The director shall be relieved of all further liabil-18 19 20 ity upon payment of a prize to a minor pursuant to 21 this section. 22 §386. State Lottery Fund; creation 23 There is created and established a separate fund to be known as the "State Lottery Fund," to be depos-24 25 ited in such depositories as the Treasurer of State 26 may select. These funds shall consist of all revenue received from the sale of lottery tickets or shares, agents' license fees and all other money credited or 27 28

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2. Apportionment. The money in the State Lottery Fund shall be apportioned so that not less than 45% of the total ticket sales received in the lottery will be disbursed as prizes to holders of winning tickets. All other money, less reasonable costs for the proper administration of the State Lottery Fund, shall be the State's share. §388. Maine state income tax; prizes exempt

The prizes received pursuant to this chapter shall be exempt from the Maine state income tax.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill clarifies operating authority and organizational integration for the lottery in the Department of Finance. It further modifies specific rules as to suspension of licenses and penalties for certain sales violations.

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
