9 10 11 12	This new draft establishes a dedicated revenue account which shall be funded by fees charged to non-governmental agencies for providing criminal history record information.
13	STATEMENT OF FACT
14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	This new draft creates the Criminal History Record Computer Account into which fee revenues are deposited that are generated from fees charged to nongovernmental agencies for providing criminal history record information to these organizations. The State Bureau of Identification does not have sufficient money to establish a computer system to maintain criminal history record information that is used by the courts, law enforcement agencies and many other organizations. The new draft provides for the creation of a user fee to be charged to nongovernmental agencies.
