STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

Resolve, to Establish the Maine Commission to
Review Overcrowding at the Augusta
Mental Health Institute and the
Bangor Mental Health Institute.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the existing conditions at the Augusta Mental Health Institute and the Bangor Mental Health Institute pose a hazard to the health and safety of both patients and staff; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Commission established. Resolved: Maine Commission to Review Overcrowding at the Augusta Mental Health Institute and the Bangor Mental Health Institute is established, consisting of 15 members, as follows: The Superintendent of the Augusta Mental Health Institute or a designee; the Superintendent of the Bangor Mental Health Institute or a designee; the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation or a designee; the Director of the Bureau of Mental Health or a designee; 7 members appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, to include: A representative of the Maine State Alliance for the Mentally Ill, a representative of the Maine Council of Community Mental Health Services, a representative of the Portland Coalition of the Psychiatrically Labelled, a representative of the Mental Health Advisory Council, consumer of community mental health services, a psychologist and a psychiatrist; 2 representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and 2 Senators, appointed by the President of the Senate; and be it further

Procedure. Resolved: That all appointments shall be made not later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve and notification shall be sent to the Chairman of the Legislative Council, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House. The commission shall hold an organizational meeting, convened by the Chairman of the Legislative Council, within 30 days of the final appointments to the commission and shall elect a chairman from among the members; and be it further

Issues studied. Resolved: That the commission shall examine overcrowding at the Augusta Mental Health Institute and the Bangor Mental Health Institute, including: The adequacy of programming and treatment alternatives for residents; the adequacy of current facilities, including space and environmental

requirements, staffing patterns and patient-staff ra-the impact of overcrowding on institution staff; safety of patients and community; community treatment and support services vital to the ongoing care of the mentally ill; the existing availability scope of these community services; the relation-ship between the adequacy of these services existing conditions at the Augusta Mental Health Ing stitute and the Bangor Mental Health Institute; other issues determined by the commission; and be it further.

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Meetings. Resolved: That the commission meet as necessary to study the issues through examination of data, consultation with staff and recognized experts and conduct public hearings; and be it further

Reports. Resolved: That the commission shall submit a report with any accompanying legislation to the Legislature in 2 parts. The first part shall be submitted on or before December 1, 1987, detailing conditions and practices at these 2 mental health institutes and making recommendations directed at alleviating these conditions. The 2nd part shall be submitted on or before September 1, 1988, detailing results and recommendations of the study of community mental health and support services; and be it further

Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall request from the Legislative Council sufficient staff assistance to carry out these duties and is authorized to hire outside consultants to conduct all or portions of the study if they so choose; and be it further

Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators shall receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission meetings. All members of the commission shall receive expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
