IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

Resolve, to Establish a Task Force on Post-secondary Education Financing.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the cost of attending post-secondary educational institutions is increasing dramatically; and

Whereas, it is unclear whether the current level and mix of types of financial aid is appropriate in light of the educational and financial needs of the State's post-secondary students; and

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Whereas, a consistent, coordinated financial aid
 effort is essential to encourage and enable Maine
 students to attend post-secondary institutions; and

4 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 5 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 6 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 7 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-8 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 9 therefore, be it

10Task force established. Resolved: That there is11established the Task Force on Post-secondary Educa-12tion Financing consisting of 14 members as follows:

13 1. Legislators. One Senator and 2 members of 14 the House of Representatives, appointed jointly by 15 the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the 16 House, at least one of whom shall be a member of the 17 Joint Standing Committee on Education;

18 2. Gubernatorial appointments. One officer of a bank or other financial institution who has experi-19 20 ence in the administration of student loan programs, one member who is a student currently enrolled in a 21 22 post-secondary educational institution in the State 23 and receiving financial aid and one parent of a student in a post-secondary educational institution who is receiving financial aid, to be appointed by the 24 25 26 Governor;

27 3. Commissioner. The Commissioner of Education28 al and Cultural Services or a designee;

4. Guidance counselor. One member who is a secondary education guidance or career counselor familiar with student aid programs, to be appointed by the
Maine Personnel and Guidance Association; and

33 Financial aid officer. Two members who are 5. 34 private financial aid administrators in а institution, one of which is a 35 post-secondary business-oriented institution; 2 members who are 36 fi-37 nancial aid administrators at a campus of the Univer-38 sity of Maine System; one member who is a financial aid administrator at the Maine Maritime Academy; and one member who is a financial aid administrator at a 39 40

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vocational-technical institute, to be appointed by the Maine Association of Financial Aid Directors.

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Appointments shall be made within 15 days of the effective date of this resolve and notice sent to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council. Within 15 days of the completion of the appointment of the members, the chairman of the Legislative Council shall convene the first meeting, when the members shall elect a chairman; and be it further

All members of the com-6 mission shall receive reimbursement for expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the Legisla-7 tive Council; and be it further 8 9 Report.
