IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Require the Installation of Telecommunication Devices for the Hearing and Speech Impaired in Public Facilities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §7505 is enacted to read:

The departments will submit the necessary legislation and requests for any supplemen-16 17 tal funding by January 1, 1988.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

19 This new draft modifies the original bill to make 20 a reasonable step toward equal access for speech or 21 hearing impaired persons to public telephones without excessive cost. The new draft restricts the require-22 23 ment in state buildings to those with a primary func-24 tion of delivery of services to the general public 25 and implements the program in accordance with a plan, 26 to be developed by the Bureau of Rehabilitation and Department of Administration. For other public the facilities, the new draft selects 3 categories: Airports; bus and train terminals; and hospitals and requires the owner or manager of the public facility to provide a telecommunication device for the hearing and speech impaired.

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
