AN ACT to Require Licensing of Adult Day Care

Services in Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §7702, as amended by PL 1983, c. 691, §1, is further amended to read:

§7702. Violation; penalty

§8603. License

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12 Beginning on July 1, 1988, no person or combina-13 tion of persons may operate an adult day care program in this State without having obtained a license to 14 operate an adult day care program from the Department 15 16 of Human Services.

§8604. Fee for license

18 The department shall charge a reasonable fee for a license. There may be differential fees charged to programs based on numbers of participants, type of 19 20 21 license or other considerations.

§8605. Fire safety

23 No license may be is- Inspection required. 24 sued by the department for an adult day care program until the department has received from the State Fire 25 Marshal a written statement signed by one of the of-26 ficials designated under Title 25, section 2360, 2391 27 or 2392 to make fire safety inspections. This state-ment, which shall indicate that a facility has com-28 29 30 plied with the applicable fire safety provisions re-31 ferred to in subsection 2 and Title 25, section 2452, shall be furnished annually by the State Fire Marshal 32 33 to the department.

Life safety code. The written statement which shall be furnished annually by the State Fire Marshal to the department shall indicate that the adult day care program has complied with at least the requirements of the Life Safety Code of the National Fire Protection Association as adopted by the State Fire Marshal which are specified in:

21	This new draft requires the Department of Human
22	Services to charge a fee to offset the cost of issu-
23	ing a license to facilities providing Adult Day Care
24	Programs. The total estimated revenue from the 10 to
25	12 such facilities in the State is \$350. The new
26	draft includes an allocation section to provide these
27	funds to the Bureau of Maine's Elderly as the program

coordinator.

2 3 4	This new draft amends the original bill, establishing licensure for adult day care services, as follows:
5 6	 Amends the title to reflect licensing instead of certification;
7 8 9 10	 Amends the definition of an adult day care program to include adults under the age of 60 and to exclude day activity programs licensed by the Depart- ment of Mental Health and Mental Retardation;

- 11 3. Requires the Department of Human Services to 12 consult with provider agencies and the Maine Commit-13 tee on Aging in its rulemaking;
- 14 4. Delays the effective date when licenses are required to July 1988;
- 5. Modifies the fire safety language;
- 6. Adds an allocation section and fiscal note; and
- 7. Waives compliance with the licensing require ment for facilities already licensed.
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
