HOUSE AMENDMENT "H" to H.P. 1311, L.D. 1789,
Bill, "AN ACT to Provide Discretion to the State Liquor Commission to Establish Temporary Agency Liquor
Stores in Response to Natural Disasters."

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11 Amend the Bill by striking out all of the title 12 and inserting in its place the following: 'AN ACT to 13 Provide Discretion to the State Liquor Commission to 14 Establish a Temporary Agency Liquor Store in Response 15 to a Natural Disaster.'

16 Further amend the Bill by striking out everything 17 after the title and inserting in its place the fol-18 lowing:

19 'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-20 lature do not become effective until 90 days after 21 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

22 Whereas, the State Liquor Commission has no dis-23 cretion to shorten the lengthy procedure for estab-24 lishing an agency liquor store for any reason, even 25 when circumstances indicate that such action is war-26 ranted; and

27 Whereas, a natural disaster has forced a state 28 liquor store located in the City of Gardiner to close 29 and that site is not available for a state liquor 30 store, so that the area will not be adequately served 31 by the State Liquor Commission; and

32 Whereas, because such a situation exists, the 33 State Liquor Commission should have the discretion to 34 license an agency liquor store to serve as a replace-35 ment on a strictly temporary basis until the state 36 liquor store in the City of Gardiner can be reopened 37 in the original or a new location; and HOUSE AMENDMENT "#" to H.P. 1311, L.D. 1789

1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 2 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 3 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 4 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-5 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 6 therefore, •. •

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7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 8 follows:

9 Sec. 1. Commission authorized to establish re-10 placement store. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 28, section 153 and Title 28-A, sec-11 12 tion 453, the State Liquor Commission may establish a temporary replacement agency liquor store to serve 13 14 the same area served by the state liquor store in the 15 City of Gardiner which was forced to close because of flooding in April of 1987. A temporary agency liquor 16 17 store established pursuant to this Act may operate until the same or a new state liquor store is opened, 18 19 but in no case for more than 120 days.

20 Sec. 2. Procedure for selection. The following 21 procedures apply to the establishment of a temporary 22 replacement agency liquor store pursuant to this Act.

1. The commission shall give, in accordance with
 the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 9052,
 public notice that a temporary replacement agency li quor store may be established in the City of
 Gardiner. The commission shall request all parties
 interested in establishing a temporary replacement
 agency liquor store to apply to the commission.

30 2. The commission shall set a deadline for ap31 plications of no earlier than 7 days after the date
32 of the publication of the first public notice.

33 3. The commission shall provide all applicants
34 with the necessary information for the establishment
35 of a temporary replacement agency liquor store.

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1 4. If requested, the commission shall hold a 2 hearing, according to Title 5, chapter 375, subchap-3 ter IV, on the selection of the location for the tem-4 porary replacement agency liquor store at least 15 5 days after the date of the publication of the first 6 public notice.

7 5. The commission shall notify any applicant de-8 nied a license of the reasons for the denial by cer-9 tified mail to the mailing address given by the ap-10 plicant in the application for the temporary replace-11 ment agency store license.

6. Any applicant aggrieved by a decision made by
the commission may appeal the decision in accordance
with Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter VII.

15 Sec. 3. State liquor store employees. The com-16 mission may not terminate the employment of persons 17 employed at the state liquor store in the City of 18 Gardiner which closed while the temporary replacement agency store is in operation, but shall make reason-19 20 able arrangements for their continued employment un-21 til they can be returned to the same or new state li-22 quor store.

23 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited 24 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-25 proved.'

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HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1311, L.D. 1789

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This amendment replaces the bill and gives the 3 State Liquor Commission discretion to establish an 4 agency liquor store which will serve as a temporary 5 replacement for the state liquor store in the City of 6 Gardiner which is closed because of the April 1987, flood. The restrictions regarding the establishment 7 of agency liquor stores, such as procedure and the 8 10-mile spacing requirement, do not apply to this temporary replacement agency liquor store. 9 10

11 Under this amendment, the temporary replacement 12 agency liquor store in the City of Gardiner may oper-13 ate for no longer than 120 days.

14 This amendment retains the same procedural safe-15 guards afforded to interested parties in the bill.

16 The amendment also retains the provision from the 17 bill which ensures that employees at the state liquor 18 store which closed will not lose their jobs because 19 of the operation of the temporary replacement agency 20 liquor store.
