AN ACT to Require Maintenance of Financial
Responsibility by All Motorists.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

29 MRS A §790 is enacted to read:

§790. Uncompensated injured persons data collection

1. Secretary of State to prepare list. The Secretary of State shall prepare a monthly list of all accidents involving any uninsured operator of a motor vehicle which results in bodily injury to any person, other than the uninsured operator, for a period of one year beginning January 1, 1988. This list shall be sent to the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis.

1 This list must include, at a minimum, the names and
2 addresses of persons injured in these accidents.

3 2. Survey of injured persons. The Office of
4 Policy and Legal Analysis shall survey a random sam-
5 ple of those persons with bodily injury on the list
6 in order to determine the following:

7 A. The number of these persons injured by unin-
8 jured operators of motor vehicles who were not
9 compensated fully by the uninsured operator or by
10 any health or accident insurance policy; and

11 B. The amount of money which would be necessary
12 to establish a fund to compensate these persons.

13 3. Report. The Office of Policy and Legal Anal-
14 ysis shall report the results of the survey described
15 in subsection 2, and any recommendations to the joint
16 standing committee having jurisdiction over insurance
17 by January 15, 1990.

18 STATEMENT OF FACT

19 This new draft provides for a study of the uncom-
20 pensated victims of uninsured motorists, in order to
21 determine whether a fund is necessary and the amount
22 that would be needed.

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
