1 AN ACT to Enhance the Certification of 2 Educational Personnel Law. 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine 4 as follows: 5 20-A MRSA §13011, sub-§1, as enacted by 6 Sec. 1. PL 1983, c. 845, §4, is amended to read: 7 8 1. Certification and revocation rules. All Except as provided in section 13014, subsection 5, and section 13018, all teacher certificates issued or re-9 10 voked after June 30, 1988, and all administrator and 11 other professional certificates issued or revoked af-12 June 30, 1989, shall be in accordance with this 13 ter 14 chapter. The Except as provided in section 13014, subsection 5, the state board shall adopt rules prior 15

1 to April 1, 1988 to carry out the purposes of this 2 chapter under which the commissioner shall:
 A. Certify teachers and other professional per- sonnel for service in a public school or in an approved private school;
 B. Certify adult education teachers and other teaching and professional personnel in publicly-supported educational programs other than post high school institutions, colleges and universities;
11 C. Approve the employment of teacher aides, 12 teacher assistants and other semiprofessional 13 personnel for service in schools; and
14D. Seek a revocation of a certificate in the Ad-15ministrative Court.

19 1. <u>Definition</u> . A professional <u>level I</u> teacher 20 certificate is a renewable certificate issued to an 21 individual who has held a provisional certificate and 22 has met the qualifications of this section.
23 2. <u>Qualifications.</u> State board rules governing 24 the qualifications for a professional <u>level I</u> teacher 25 certificate shall require that the certificate may 26 only be issued to an applicant who, at a minimum:
 A. Holds a provisional teacher certificate or has held a professional <u>level I</u> teacher certifi- cate which has expired within the last 5 years;
30B. Taught in a classroom for 2 academic years;31and
 32 C. Received a recommendation to the superintend- 33 ent and commissioner by an approved support sys- 34 tem, pursuant to section 13015.

Effective date. Notwithstanding the July 1, 9 5. 1988, reference in section 13011, the state board 10 11 shall establish as a target date, September-17-1987 July 1, 1989, to adopt rules governing the issuance of master professional level II teacher certificates. Following the effective date of these rules, eligible 12 13 14 15 teachers may apply to qualify for a master professional level II teacher certificate. Master Profes-sional level II teacher certificates may be issued 16 17 18 starting in July 1988 1, 1990.

Teacher action plan. A teacher action plan is 4. developed by the support system in consultation with the teacher who is the subject of the plan. The specific teacher action plan shall describe the skills which must be developed and improved by the teacher, as well as any other requirements, which may include additional professional graduate and advanced study, in order to achieve a positive recommendation to receive a higher level of certificate. A teacher action plan shall contain the basis for the positive or negative recommendation of a support system as to whether a teacher should be granted a professional level I teacher certificate or a master professional level II teacher certificate, as applicable.

Sec. 6. 20-A MRSA \$13016, sub-\$\$2 and 3, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 845, \$4, are amended to read:

2. <u>Professional level I teacher certificates.</u> A professional <u>level I</u> teacher certificate may be renewed for 5-year periods in accordance with state board rules which shall require, at a minimum, a recommendation of a support system and that the teacher complete at least 6 hours of professional or academic study, or in-service training designed to improve the performance of the teacher in the field for which the teacher holds an endorsement, or in a related subject area. Teachers who desire to qualify for a master professional level II teacher certificate shall coordinate their continuing professional education with the requirements of an applicable teacher action plan.

3. Professional level II teacher certificate. A master professional level II teacher certificate may be renewed for 5-year periods in accordance with state board rules which shall require, at a minimum, that the master professional level II teacher has obtained a recommendation of the support system that the master professional level II teacher has maintained a high level of professional teacher skills. If the holder of a master professional level ΙI teacher certificate fails to maintain mester professional level II teacher skills or chooses not to seek a renewal of the master professional level II teacher certificate, the teacher will be deemed to hold a professional level I teacher certificate and shall meet the requirements for its renewal.

The state board shall review teacher and administrator certificate standards every-6-years annually and report the results of its review to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education, along with any proposed legislation. The first report to the Begislature committee shall be due starting-with-the--legislative session-beginning in December January 1990. In addition to information requested by the committee and other materials deemed relevant by the board, that report shall include an update of rule-making activity accomplished since the last report and an assessment of the use of conditional certificates.

Sec. 11. Interim reports. In addition to the report required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 13021, beginning in 1990, the State Board of Education shall report periodically to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education as follows:

Generally continues July 1, 1988, as the im-13 plementation date for the teacher certification law, 14 but allows teachers whose current certificate expires on July 30, 1988, to renew their certificate under 15 the old law if they wish and provides for a continua-16 tion of pilot projects on the 3rd level of certifica-17 tion and for delayed implementation of that level; 18 19 and 20 5. Changes the 6-year review and reporting re-21 quirement by the State Board of Education on certifi-22 cation issues to an annual one and establishes a se-23 ries of interim reports on the implementation of the teacher and administrator certification law prior to 24 25 the first annual report.
