1 AN ACT to Make Supplemental Allocations to
2 the Department of Inland Fisheries and
3 Wildlife for the Fiscal Years Ending
4 June 30, 1988, and June 30, 1989.

6 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
7 lature do not become effective until 90 days after
8 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

9 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-
10 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

11 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-
12 dent to the operation of the department will become
13 due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1987;
14 and

1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
2 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
3 the Constitution of Maine and require the following
4 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-
5 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,
6 therefore,

7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
8 follows:

9 Sec. 1. Supplemental allocation of the Depart-
10 ment of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife funds. Income
11 to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife
12 for the fiscal years from July 1, 1987, to June 30,
13 1988, and from July 1, 1988, to June 30, 1989, shall
14 be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as desig-
15 nated in the following schedule:

14 **Sec. 3. Adjustments to allocations.** Allocations
15 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Of-
16 ficer with the approval of the Governor to specifi-
17 cally cover those adjustments determined to be neces-
18 sary under any salary plan approved by the Legisla-
19 ture and those reclassifications or range changes
20 which have been approved by the Department of Admin-
21 istration and submitted for legislative review prior
22 to the effective date of this Act.

23 **Sec. 4. Encumbered balances at year-end.** At the
24 end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances
25 shall not be carried more than once.

26 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited
27 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect on July
28 1, 1987.
