Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after

Whereas, current law must be clarified to make clear that tribal governments, like other borrowers, can grant security interests in tribal property; and

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1 2 3 4 5	Whereas, an immediate change in Article 9 of the Maine Uniform Commercial Code enabling tribal governments to grant security interests is necessary, so that they may obtain credit and continue the operation of enterprises owned by the tribes; and
6 7 8 9 10	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
