1 2 3	AN ACT to Clarify the Authority for Judicial Suspension of Motor Vehicle Licenses.
4 5 6	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
7 8 9 10	Whereas, it is necessary to immediately clarify the authority of the court to suspend motor vehicle operators' licenses for failure to appear in court; and
11 12 13 14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-

1 2	vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
3 4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
5 6	29 MRSA §2301-A, first ¶, as amended by PL 1981, c. 679, §57, is further amended to read:
7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17	If a person fails to appear in court on the day specified in response to a Uniform Traffic Ticket and Complaint, a summons, a condition of bail or order of court for any violation of Title 23, section 1980, Title 28, section 1001 or any provision of this Title, or for any further appearance ordered by the court, including one for the payment of a fine, either in person or by counsel, the court shall suspend his license or permit, his right to operate motor vehicles in this State and the right to apply for or obtain a license. The effective date of the suspension shall be governed by section 2241-E.
19 20 21	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
22	STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to clarify that the court may suspend a driver's license for failure to appear for all so-called moving violations, including illegal transportation of alcohol by a minor and exceeding the speed limit on the Maine Turnpike.
