6 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 7 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 8 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 9 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-10 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 11 therefore,

12 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 13 follows:

14 15 MRSA \$1205, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 15 411, is amended to read:

16 A hearsay statement made by a person under the 17 age of 14 15 years, describing any incident involving 18 sexual intercourse, a sexual act or sexual contact 19 performed with or on the minor by another, shall not 20 be excluded as evidence in criminal proceedings in 21 courts of this State if:

22 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 23 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-24 proved.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

26 children 13 years of age or Current law allows younger, who are the victims of 27 sexual crimes, to 28 provide testimony outside an open court room setting 29 if confrontation between the victim and the perpetrato the 30 tor of the crime will be harmful mental or 31 physical well-being of the victim. This bill increases the age of the victim for whom the protection 32 of the law will apply from 13 years to 14 years of 33 34 age.

The purpose of this bill is to protect current and future 14-year-old victims of sexual crimes. The

14-year-old victim is as vulnerable to mental or physical instability as a 13-year-old victim when confronted with the perpetrator of the crime in the court room.
