10 11	Amend the bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble.
12 13	Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 2 and inserting in its place the following:

This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Eastport voting at the primary election in June, 1988. The election shall be called, advertised and conducted according to the law relating to municipal elections; provided, however, that the registrar of voters of the city shall not be required to prepare for posting, nor the city clerk to post, a new list of voters and for the purpose of registration of voters the registrar shall be in session the 3 secular days next preceding the election, the first 2 days thereof to be devoted to registration of voters and the last day to enable the registrar to verify the correction of the lists and to complete and close up his records of the sessions. Prior to the vote or this referendum the port authority shall hold not fewer than 2 public hearings for the purpose of receiving information, views and comments on this issue. Notice of these hearings shall be given at least 10 days before the hearing in all newspapers of general circulation within the City of Eastport. This notice shall contain the full text of the referendum question. The city clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this Act to the following question:

- 1 1. That all directors be elected by the voters
 2 of Eastport;
- 5 3. That no member of the Eastport City Council or any city manager of Eastport be a director?"
- 7 The voters shall indicate by a cross or check 8 mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.

10 Upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal 11 voters voting at the election, this Act shall 12 effect for all the purposes hereof; provided that the 13 total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of this Act at the meeting equals or exceeds 14 15 20% of the total number of votes cast for Governor in 16 the city at the last gubernatorial election. Another 17 election may be held if the total number of 18 cast in the first election does not equal or exceed 19 20%.

This Act shall take effect for all the purposes hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election. The result of the election shall be declared by the municipal officers of the City of Eastport and due certificate filed by the city clerk with the Secretary of State. Notwithstanding Private and Special Law 1977, chapter 14, section 1, as amended by this Act, the terms of any current directors of the authority no longer qualified for membership shall continue until the city election of the City of Eastport in December, 1988. These appointed directors shall hold the office until directors are elected at the next election as provided in this Act.'



SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1396, L.D. 1895

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STATEMENT	OF.	FACT

This amendment removes the emergency status of 3 the bill. It specifies that the vote on the referendum to change the requirements for membership in the 4 Eastport Port Authority be held in conjunction with 5 6 the primary election in June, 1988. It leaves in office until the city election in December, 1988, any 7 8 members who are disqualified as members by the provisions of the bill. It makes the wording of the ref-erendum question specific as to the amendments pro-posed. Voters are to vote on the changes in total; not on each individual change. It requires 2 public 9 10 11 12 13 hearings prior to the vote on the referendum.
