23 24 25	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this resolve is to change the reporting deadline for the study of the allocation of water rights from December 1, 1987, to February 1, 1988.
