STATEMENT OF FACT

The Commission to Implement the Computerization of Criminal History Record Information was created in 1986 in order to oversee a cost-effective and efficient computerized criminal history records information system that would satisfy the needs of the various users representing the areas of law enforcement, corrections and the judiciary. Due to the complexity of the task, the development and implementation of this system will exceed original target dates.

The commission is requesting an additional year to continue its investigation of the automation and computerization of the State's criminal history records. Rather than submitting its report and recommendations to the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature, the commission would submit its final report and recommendations in January, 1989, to the First Regular Session of the 114th Legislature.

The commission is also requesting a \$15,000 Gen-

eral Fund appropriation in order to contract with an independent computer consultant who would provide the commission and participating state and local agencies with needed technical assistance.

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
