13	Further amend the bill by striking out everything
14	after the title and before the statement of fact and
15	inserting in its place the following:
16	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-
17	lature do not become effective until 90 days after
18	adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
19	Whereas, traces of nematode have been found in
20	Prince Edward Island and the varroa mite pest is af-
21	fecting the beekeeping industry in Maine; and
22	Whereas, the potato farmers in Maine are most
23	concerned that this infestation may spread to their
24	potato fields and damage their crops and and honeybee
25	beekeepers in Maine must take action to eradicate the
26	varroa mite pest before more damage is done to
27	healthy hives; and
28	Whereas, it is most necessary to appropriate mon-
29	ey in order to support research to prevent any harm
30	to the State's potato crop and to take immediate
31	steps to protect the pollination capacity of the
32	State's honeybee industry; and
33	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,
34	these facts create an emergency within the meaning of
35	the Constitution of Maine and require the following

1 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 2 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-3 proved.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

Traces of nematode have been found in Prince Ed-ward Island. The presence of the nematode pest in Maine would endanger Maine's potato industry. More-5 6 7 over, several bee colonies have been infected with 8 9 the varroa mite parasite which weakens honeybees and 10 threatens their ability to withstand the winter. 11 This amendment appropriates money for testing soils and for parasite eradication measures to deal with 12 13 the threat posed by both of these pests.
