7 SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 703, L.D. 1928,
8 Bill, "AN ACT to Reform the Maine Workers' Compensation
9 Act to Assure Coverage for Maine Workers."

10 Amend the bill by inserting after section 53 the
11 following:

12 'Sec. 53-A. Feasibility study; early interven-
13 tion; case management. The Workers' Compensation
14 Commission shall study the feasibility of implement-
15 ing early intervention and case management systems in
16 State Government. Included in the study shall be the
17 anticipated costs of each of these systems and the
18 anticipated overall savings which will result from
19 implementation of each of these systems. The commis-
20 sion shall also identify what implications the imple-
21 mentation of each of these systems in the State will
22 have on workplace safety, on rehiring, retraining and
23 rehabilitation and the workers' compensation system
24 as a whole. The commission shall make its report,
25 including any necessary implementing legislation, to
26 the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature
27 no later than January 29, 1988.'
