SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 704, L.D. 1929, Bill, "AN ACT to Revise the Procedure by which Insurance Rates are Established under the Maine Workers' Compensation Act."
Amend the amendment by inserting after section 53 the following:
'Sec. 53-A. Feasibility study; early intervention; case management. The Workers' Compensation Commission shall study the feasibility of implementing early intervention and case management systems in State Government. Included in the study shall be the anticipated costs of each of these systems and the anticipated overall savings which will result from implementation of each of these systems. The commission shall also identify what implications the implementation of each of these systems in the State will have on workplace safety, on rehiring, retraining and rehabilitation and the workers' compensation system as a whole. The commission shall make its report, including any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature no later than January 29, 1988.'
