STATEMENT OF FACT

The intent of the original geographic isolation grants law was to assist with additional state subsidy those geopgraphically isolated schools which experience inordinately high education costs by virtue of their inaccessibility to nearby schools.

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This bill addresses the existing financial crises which exist in towns that are geographically isolated and receive no state funding.

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
