Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it is necessary to assure that Maine's citizens are not facing discrimination because of their age; and

Whereas, the current law penalizes individuals who remarry after the age of 70 by discontinuing spousal

benefits; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

- 8 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 10 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17805, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted 11 by PL 1985, c. 801, §§5 and 7, is amended to read:
- 12 A. The original spouse must have been the sole 13 beneficiary of the reduced retirement benefit 14 under section 17804, subsection 3, 4 or 5; and
- 15 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §17805, sub-§1, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801, §§5 and 7, is repealed.
- 17 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 18 cited in the preamble, this Act Resolve shall take 19 effect when approved.

20 STATEMENT OF FACT

- Currently, Maine State Retirement laws penalize individuals who marry after the age of 70. Individuals over the age of 70 are not allowed to elect a benefit for their new spouse.
- Current law discriminates against people in Maine who decide to remarry after the age of 70; therefore, this bill deletes the section from the law which discriminates against individuals over the age of 70.
