7 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " \mathcal{H} " to H.P. 1458, L.D. 1969, 8 Bill, "AN ACT to Provide Protection from Molestation 9 to Fixed Fishing Gear."

10 Amend the bill by striking out all of the title 11 and inserting in its place the following:

12 'AN ACT to Make Changes in Marine Resources Laws.'

13 Further amend the bill by striking out everything 14 after the enacting clause and inserting in its place 15 the following:

16 'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6024, sub-§1, as amended by 17 PL 1985, c. 481, Pt. A, §35, is further amended to 18 read:

19 Appointment; composition; term; compensation. 1. 20 The advisory council, established by Title 5, section 12004, subsection 10, shall consist of 9 members. One 21 22 member shall be the chairman of the Lobster Advisory Council, ex officio. Each other member shall be 23 appointed by the Governor and shall be subject to 24 appointed by the governor and shall be subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources and to confirmation by the Legislature. Eight Seven of the appointed members shall be selected from persons directly engaged in commercial activities or industries based on marine resources, and one of the appointed members shall be selected from persons who represent recreational fishing interests. The 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32

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composition of the council shall adequately represent 1 2 the commercial fisheries' activities over which the 3 department has jurisdiction and shall also reflect a geographical distribution along the coast. 4 A11 appointed members shall be appointed for a term of 3 years, except a vacancy shall be filled in the same 5 6 manner as an original for the unexpired portion of the term. No member may serve more than 2 consecutive terms at any one time. Members shall serve until their 7 8 9 10 successors are appointed. Members shall be 11 compensated as provided in Title 5, chapter 379.

12 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6141, sub-§5, as enacted by PL
13 1985, c. 677, §1, is amended to read:

14 Report. The commissioner shall prepare an 5. 15 annual report to the Legislature setting out the accomplishments of the previous year and an updated, 5-year research plan for future activities with 16 17 proposed budget requirements. The report shall be 18 reviewed by the Lobster Advisory Council prior to submission to the Legislature. The report shall be 19 20 submitted to the joint standing committee of the 21 22 Legislature having jurisdiction over marine resources 23 on or before January-1st March 15th of each year.

24 Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §6526 is enacted to read:

25 §6526. Molesting equipment

26 <u>1. Prohibition. It is unlawful for any person,</u> 27 <u>except a marine patrol officer, the licensed owner or</u> 28 <u>a person having written permission from the licensed</u> 29 <u>owner, to raise, lift, transfer, possess or in any</u> 30 <u>manner intentionally interfere with any trap, net or</u> 31 <u>other equipment which is :</u>

32 A. Authorized under this chapter and which is set 33 for the taking of fish; or

34 B. Set for the purposes of aquaculture by a 35 person holding a license under this chapter.

36 Sec. 4. 12 MRSA §6741, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 37 1985, c. 586, is amended to read:

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4. Quahogs raised by means of aquaculture. Any

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1 person may take, possess, ship, transport, buy or sell 2 quahogs that are more than 1/2 inch and less than 2 3 inches if those quahogs were raised by means of 4 aquaculture. The commission may promulgate rules 5 providing for the identification of quahogs raised by 6 means of aquaculture. This subsection is repeated 7 on-September-17-1988.

8 Sec. 5. 12 MRSA §6746, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 9 1987, c. 328, §3, is amended to read:

10 2. Licensed activity. A boat license under this 11 section may be used for dragging for mussels. The 12 license shall also authorize the captain and up to 13 2 crew members aboard the licensed boat when engaged 14 in dragging for mussels to undertake these activities.

15 Sec. 6. Transition. In order to accomplish the 16 purpose of section 1 of this Act, the first vacancy in 17 the advisory council occurring after the effective 18 date of this Act of a member engaged in commercial or 19 industrial activities shall be filled by the chairman 20 of the Lobster Advisory Council.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

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22 This amendment makes the following changes in 23 marine resources laws.

24 Sections 1 and 6 provide that the chairman of the 25 Lobster Advisory Council shall be a member of the 26 Marine Resources Advisory Council.

27 Section 2 changes the date for the submission of 28 the annual lobster research report from January 1st to 29 March 15th in order to allow coordination with a 30 similar federal report.

31 Section 3 prohibits the molestation of fishing 32 gear.

33 Section 4 repeals the sunset on a provision 34 permitting the taking of quahogs greater than 1/2 inch 35 if they were raised by means of aquaculture.

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Section 5 permits crews of more than 2 members to
 be covered under a mussel boat license.

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
