3 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment clarifies the authority of the Department of Marine Resources to conduct watercraft safety inspections and to search and inspect for violations of marine resources laws. This amendment does not limit the authority of marine patrol officers to search for or seize contraband in situations where the search or seizure is otherwise permitted by law.
