4 5 6	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
7 8 9 10	Whereas, certain boarding care facilities in particular parts of the State are experiencing great difficulty in attracting and retaining qualified personnel; and

1 2 3 4	Whereas, these facilities are significantly impeded by the existing reimbursement structure which imposes a monthly payment "ceiling" on recognition of otherwise reasonable costs; and
5 6 7 8 9	Whereas, there is currently no requirement in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, chapter 1665, entitled Boarding Care Facilities, which provides for payment of reasonable costs to residents of boarding care facilities having more than 6 beds; and
10 11 12 13 14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
16 17	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

21 22	Except as otherwise provided in section $7906-A$, the department shall:
23 24 25	 Adult foster homes. Reimburse all approved adult foster homes at a rate of at least \$225 per month; and

Reimburse all boarding care facilities of 6 or fewer beds, except as provided in section 7906 7906-A, on a flat rate basis, which rate shall be increased effective as of July 1, 1986, and on January 1st of each year after 1986 by the estimated percentage increase in the cost of goods and services purchased by health care facilities during the prior year, as published by Data

This methodology shall be submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources on or before February 1, 1989, setting forth the proposed elements of the methodology, together with any proposed legislation necessary to establish the methodology. The report shall also include proposed regulations in draft form necessary to implement the proposed methodology.

	22 23 24	The department shall remove the ceiling on routine services for all boarding care facilities that have difficulty recruiting and retaining staff.
	25 26 27	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
	28	STATEMENT OF FACT
	29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36	Boarding care facilities in many parts of the State are experiencing great difficulty in attracting and retaining qualified staff. One of the reasons is the inability of boarding care facilities to pay a reasonable area wage to attract qualified personnel. This is due to the existing reimbursement structure which imposes a monthly payment "ceiling" on the recognition of otherwise reasonable costs.

1	This bill amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title
2	22, chapter 1665, to require that boarding care
3	facility cost based reimbursement be reimbursed for
4	the reasonable costs of operating the facility. The
5	bill requires the Department of Human Services to
6	develop, after consultation with provider and consumer
7	groups, a methodology for reimbursing boarding care
	facilities on the basis of their reasonable costs for
9	providing services. This methodology will be reported
L O	to the joint standing committee of the Legislature
Ll	having jurisdiction over human resources.
