1 2 3	AN ACT Relating to the Powers of the Maine Youth Center Employees.
4 5	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
6	34-A MRSA §3813 is enacted to read:

§3813. Power of center employees

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The Maine Youth Center employees have the same power as sheriffs in their respective counties to

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search for and apprehend escapees from the center, when authorized to do so by the superintendent.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

At present, there is no provision in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 34-A, which gives Maine Youth Center employees legal powers to go after youths 5 6 7 absent without leave from the center. This puts 8 center employees in an ambiguous position when they are faced with apprehending runaways from the center. 9 10 This bill provides the same powers for center 11 employees as those available to employees of other Department of Corrections institutions. Due to the 12 continuing problem of runaways from the Maine Youth 13 Center there is an urgent and immediate need for this 14 15 bill.

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
