STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Amend the Law Concerning the Blaine House Scholars Program.

4 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 5 follows:

6 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §12501, sub-§§1-A and 3-A are 7 enacted to read:

<u>1-A. College students. "College students" means</u> those students who have previously graduated from a

Maine high school and are attending an institution of higher education on a full-time basis at the time of application for program participation.

4 <u>3-A. Graduating high school seniors. "Graduating</u> 5 <u>high school seniors" means those students who graduate</u> 6 from a Maine high school at the end of the academic 7 year and who will be entering their first year in an 8 institution of higher education at the beginning of 9 the next academic year. Academic year is considered 10 to be a September to June time period.

11 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA \$12502, as enacted by PL 12 1983, c. 859, Pt. F, §§1 and 2, is amended to read:

# 13 §12502. Blaine House Scholars and Financial Assistance Program

15 There is established the Blaine House Scholars and Financial Assistance Program to recognize Maine high school graduates who attain high academic achievement, 16 17 financial assistance for post-secondary 18 to provide 19 education of graduating high school students seniors and college students and advanced degree or 20 21 The program shall continued study by teachers. 22 outstanding graduating recognize high school 23 students seniors and college students as described 24 in section 12503 and disburse interest free loans as 25 described in section 12504. The program shall be 26 administered by the commissioner.

27 Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §12503, first ¶, as enacted 28 by PL 1983, c. 859, Pt. F, §§1 and 2, is amended to 29 read:

30 year graduating high school seniors Each and 31 college students who show evidence of academic achievement 32 shall be considered for recognition as 33 Blaine House scholars. Nominations and applications shall be submitted to the commissioner at a time and in a format to be determined by rule of the 34 35 36 commissioner.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill expands the eligibility for program participation to include students enrolled in a higher education institution on a full-time basis at the time of making application. These students are in addition to graduating high school seniors. There are many Maine students at all levels of higher education who need financial aid and this program should not be restricted only to graduating high school seniors.

10 The Blaine House Scholars Program's major emphasis 11 is the encouragement of the best and brightest of our 12 Maine students to seek a career in teaching. There 13 may be many potentially excellent teachers currently 14 enrolled in a higher education institution who should 15 be made eligible for this program.
