Currently, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 28-A, section 2081, subsection 1, paragraph B, states that it is a violation to allow any minor under one's control or on one's premises under one's control to consume liquor. Courts have interpreted "premises" to mean licensed premises, where liquor is sold with a liquor license in effect. Section 2081 was meant to prohibit unlicensed persons from furnishing liquor to a minor. This bill is designed to clarify the
