STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT Converting the Unorganized Township of Big Squaw into the Town of Big Squaw.

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 6 follows:

Sec. 1. Town of Big Squaw, incorporated. The unincorporated township of Big Squaw, with its inhabitants, is incorporated into a town by the name

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of Big Squaw. The inhabitants of this town are vested with the powers, privileges and immunities which the inhabitants of towns within the State do or may enjoy. The town created shall take the effects belonging to the unorganized township of Big Squaw and shall also assume all of its obligations.

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- 7 Sec. 2. Legislative district. Until the next 8 legislative apportionment of Representatives, the Town 9 of Big Squaw shall remain in the same legislative 10 district in which the unorganized township of Big 11 Squaw is now classed.
- Sec. 3. First meeting; how called. Upon acceptance of this Act by referendum as provided in section 6, the county commissioners of Piscataquis County shall issue a warrant, in accordance with the general laws, for the first town meeting, to be held in March, April, May or June, 1989. Notification of the town meeting shall be filed by the clerk with the Secretary of State.
 - Sec. 4. Education; allocation. The Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services shall establish a basic education allocation for fiscal year 1989-90 for the Town of Big Squaw consistent with the requirements of the School Finance Act of 1985, Title 20-A, chapter 606.
- 26 Sec. 5. Referendum; certificate Secretary of State. This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters within the territory embraced within the limits of the proposed Town of Big Squaw by ballot 27 28 29 30 at a special election to be held in November This election shall be called, held and conducted by the Secretary of State in the same manner as local 31 32 33 option elections in unorganized territory 34 conducted in accordance with Title 28-A, section 122, except that no petition for election shall be required. The subject matter of sections 1 and 2 of 35 36 37 this Act shall be reduced to the following question: "Shall the unorganized township of Big Squaw be 38 incorporated into the Town of Big Squaw?" The voters 39 40 shall indicate by a cross or check mark placed against

1	the word "Yes" or "No" their opinion of the same.
2 3 4 5 6 7 8	This Act shall be approved by a majority of the lega voters voting at the special election, provided tha the total number of votes cast for and against the acceptance of sections 1 and 2 of this Act at the election equaled or exceeded 50% of the total numbe of votes cast in the unorganized township for Governo at the last gubernatorial election.
9 10 11	The result of the vote shall be declared by the Secretary of State and certificate thereof shall be filed by him in his office.

Sec. 6. Effective date. Section 3 of this Act shall take effect upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters at the special election. Sections 1, 2 and 4 of this Act shall take effect for all purposes hereof on July 1, 1989.

17 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill authorizes Big Squaw township to organize into a town.

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
