It shall consist of the following The Dean of the College of Life Sciences 4 members: 5 Agriculture Vice-president for Research Public Service of the University of Maine, 7 Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources, the Commissioner of Conservation, the Commissioner of 8 Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and $\underline{\underline{L}}$ the Commissioner 9 10 Commissioner Marine Resources and the 11 Environmental Protection, who shall serve 12 except that each ex officio officios ex officio, 13 member may delegate one of his staff an alternate with policy-making authority to serve regularly in his 14 absence, and 6 soil and water conservation district supervisors, one of which shall represent each of the 15 16 17 following 6 areas: Area 1, composed of St. 18 Valley, Central Aroostook and Southern Aroostook Soil and Water Conservation Districts; Area 2, composed of 19 20 Washington and Hancock County Soil and 21 Conservation Districts; Area 3, composed of Penobscot, Piscataquis and Somerset County Soil and Water Conservation Districts; Area 4, composed of Kennebec, 22 23 24 Knox-Lincoln and Waldo County Soil and 25 5, Districts; Conservation Area composed 26 Androscoggin Valley, Oxford and Franklin County Soil 27 and Water Conservation Districts; Area 6, composed of Cumberland and York County Soil and Water Conservation Districts.
