The department shall examine alternative methods of encouraging participation in driver education and shall report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature by December 15, 1988. - the effect of its recommendations on the number of certified driver education instructors and on private providers of driver education courses. In conducting the study, the department may request assistance from the Attorney General.
- Sec. 2. Review by joint standing committee.
  The Joint Standing Committee on Education shall review
  the report of the department and, based on that
  review, may introduce legislation dealing with driver
  education to the First Regular Session of the 114th
  Legislature.
- 12 Sec. 3. Termination. This Act shall terminate 13 on December 15, 1989.'

## 14 STATEMENT OF FACT

The original bill would have allowed school units to grant credit for driver education courses for which a fee is charged. This amendment directs the Department of Educational and Cultural Services to study the issue of granting credit for fee-based driver education courses and report to the Legislature in December, 1988.
