AN ACT to Increase the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife's Authority to Manage Black Bear Populations.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The State's black bear population is the highest in recent history and is conservatively estimated to exceed 21,000 animals. If current population trends continue, the black bear population is expected to continue to climb to more than 28,000 animals by 1990.

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ent studies conducted by the Department Fisheries and Wildlife, together with 29 of Recent 30 Inland with а 31 substantial increase in the number of bear damage complaints, indicate that the black bear population is 32 expanding beyond acceptable levels in many areas. At the present time, the annual take of black bear from 33 34 all causes is not sufficient to stabilize bear 35

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populations, and current law does not give the department the necessary flexibility to keep black bear populations at optimum levels.

purpose of this bill is to provide The the commissioner with the authority to establish special bear hunting seasons through the regulatory process, in addition to the statutory 3-month fall season, as necessary to maintain black bear populations at desirable levels. This authority will allow the commissioner to adjust the harvest of black bear on an annual basis in accordance with black bear population trends.

Under present conditions, this bill will result in additional bear hunting opportunity and a reduction in nuisance bear complaints and undesirable interactions between bears and humans. It will also create a positive economic impact in many areas of the State where people are dependent on bear hunters as a source of income.

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
