	5 6	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	7 8	23 MRSA §706, as amended by PL 1975, c. 94, is further amended to read:
	9	§706. Curbs
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Location or construction. The Department of 1 1. Transportation shall develop or approve standards for 2 3 the location or construction of curbs on each side of a way in the business district or area as defined by 4 5 the department, of any municipality for which curbs have been prescribed. Such standards shall provide 6 for the location and construction of ramps so as to 7 allow reasonable access to the crosswalks for 8 9 physically handicapped and elderly people These standards shall be adopted to fully implement the specifications in the American National Standards Institute publication "Specifications for Making 10 11 12 13 Buildings and Facilities Accessible to and Usable by Physically Handicapped People" (ANSI A 117.1, 1986). 14

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Application. Standards set for curb ramping 15 2. 16 under subsection 1 shall not apply to any existing curb on October 3, 1973; but shall apply, to the 17 extent reasonable, to all new curb construction and to 18 19 all replacement curbs constructed in order to allow 20 reasonable access to crosswalks to any new construction or reconstruction commenced after October 21 22 1, 1988.

3. <u>Physically handicapped; adequate ramping.</u> Adequate and reasonable access shall be provided for the safe and convenient movement of physically handicapped persons, including those in wheelchairs, across curbs constructed or replaced on or after Buly 17 1976 October 1, 1988, at all pedestrian crosswalks thoughout the State.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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10 11 The current law requires that the Department of Transportation adopt standards for curb ramps but does not require that these standards be consistent with any national standard for handicapped accessibility. This bill requires that any new construction or replacement of curb ramps be done in accordance with the most current national standards for handicapped accessibility as set forth by the American National Standards Institute.

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
