STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Require a Turtle Trapping License.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, snapping turtles are trapped during the summer months; and

Whereas, the disposal of unwanted snapping turtles
by trappers in the past has created a nuisance and
public health hazard; and

4 Whereas, rules regarding snapping turtles should 5 be promulgated by the department before trappers 6 become active; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 7 8 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 9 Maine and require the following Constitution of as immediately 10 legislation necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 11 12 now, therefore,

13 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 14 follows:

15 12 MRSA §7470 is enacted to read:

16 §7470. Snapping turtles

Snapping turtle license. The commissioner
shall issue licenses for trapping snapping turtles.
The fee for this license is \$10.

20 2. Rules pertaining to snapping turtles. The 21 commissioner shall promulgate rules pertaining to 22 trapping and disposing of unwanted snapping turtles.

23 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 24 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 25 approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

27 This State supports an active trade in snapping 28 turtle meat used in soups and other delicacies. However, there have been several instances of trappers disposing of dozens of unwanted, unviable turtles at a 29 30 site, when their markets dry up, creating a nuisance 31 32 and public health hazard. Public concern and 33 misunderstanding following these incidents has been

considerable. To address this problem this bill creates a license to trap snapping turtles and requires the commissioner to promulgate regulations for their trapping and disposal.
