IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

- AN ACT Pertaining to Fire Permit 1 2 Enforcement.
- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
  - 12 MRSA §9321, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7 Failure to produce; civil violation. firm corporation which engages 8 or person, 9 out-of-door burning shall produce the permit issued, on demand of authorized persons, including Fire 10

Chiefs, Town Forest Fire Wardens or their designated agents, State Forest Rangers and any law enforcement officer as defined in Title 17-A. Any person, firm or corporation which violates this subsection commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture not to exceed \$1,000 may be adjudged.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, enforcement of the statutes prohibiting open burning without a permit is hindered because the lack of a central filing system makes it hard to determine if a permit has been issued. This bill places the burden of proof on the permittee by requiring that the permit be shown to a law enforcement officer upon demand, and imposes a civil penalty for failure to produce a permit.
