7 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " ^A " to S.P. 779, L.D. 2036, 8 Bill, "AN ACT Concerning the Carrying of Concealed 9 Firearms by Licensed Private Investigators."

10 Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1 11 and inserting in its place the following:

12 'Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2001, sub-§5, as enacted by 13 PL 1985, c. 478, §2, is repealed and the following 14 enacted in its place:

15 <u>5.</u> Private investigators. Private investigators 16 <u>licensed under Title 32, chapter 89, while performing</u> 17 the duties of a private investigator.'

18 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end 19 before the statement of fact the following:

20 'Sec. 3. 32 MRSA §8120 is enacted to read:

1	certificate of firearms proficiency to any private
2	investigator licensed under this chapter if the
3	private investigator:
4	A. Passes the firearms examination prescribed by
5	the commissioner; or
6	B. Meets the requirements established by the
7	commissioner as equivalent to the firearms
8	examination.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

10 This amendment requires private investigators who 11 want to carry a firearm in the course of performing their investigative duties to pass a proficiency test as set by the Commissioner of Public Safety, or meet 12 13 the requirements equivalent to the test. Currently licensed private investigators would not have to take the test again because they would meet the equivalent 14 15 16 17 Private investigators who do not want requirements. 18 to carry a firearm while working as a private 19 investigator are not required to meet any firearm 20 proficiency requirements.

The firearms proficiency requirement would ensure that private investigators who find themselves in dangerous situations in which they would like to have a firearm for protection will know how to use that firearm. This will further the interests of safety for the private investigator and the public at large, while not placing unnecessary requirements on private investigators who do not want to carry firearms.

29 A private investigator who wishes to carry a concealed firearm other than while performing private 30 31 investigative duties, whether or not that private 32 certificate firearms investigator has а of 33 proficiency, will have to apply for and obtain a concealed firearms permit. 34
