## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-EIGHT

AN ACT to Amend Reporting Deadlines under the Therapeutic Pharmaceutical Monitoring Panel.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not expire until after the reporting deadline has passed; and

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1 Whereas, it is imperative that the Therapeutic 2 Pharmaceutical Monitoring Panel be given sufficient 3 time to prepare its report to the Legislature; and

4 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 5 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the 6 Constitution of Maine and require the following 7 legislation as immediately necessary for the 8 preservation of the public peace, health and safety; 9 now, therefore,

10 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 11 follows:

12 32 MRSA §2428, sub-§6, as enacted by PL 1987, 13 c. 439, §15 and c. 542, Pt. K, §§15 and 20, is amended 14 to read:

15 Report to the Legislature and Governor. 6. The 16 shall prepare and submit reports to the panel Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of 17 the House, the State Board of Optometry and the State 18 Board of Registration in Medicine. The reports ahll summarize the findings of the panel regarding the use 19 20 21 therapeutic pharmaceutical agents and shall be of signed by all members of the panel. A report shall be submitted on the following dates: June July 30, 22 23 24 1988; January 30, 1989; June 30, 1989; and January 30, 25 1990.

26 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 27 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 28 approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to amend the reporting date of the Therapeutic Pharmaceutical Monitoring Panel to allow one month between the report from the optometrists and the subsequent panel report to the Legislature.

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
