1 AN ACT to Authorize the City of Old Town to
2 Acquire Land from the University of Maine to
3 Construct a Solid Waste Disposal System.

5 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the
6 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days
7 after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

8 Whereas, in the conveyance of this property, the
9 construction of necessary solid waste facilities is
10 contemplated in 1988; and

1 Whereas, this construction cannot be started until
2 the title to the land is clear; and

3 Whereas, this conveyance cannot be made in time
4 for the construction to be started unless this Act
5 becomes effective immediately upon its approval; and

6 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these
7 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the
8 Constitution of Maine and require the following
9 legislation as immediately necessary for the
10 preservation of the public peace, health and safety;
11 now, therefore,

12 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
13 follows:

14 **Acquisition of land.** The Legislature hereby
15 grants to the City of Old Town the right to acquire a
16 certain parcel of land from the University of Maine by
17 allowing the City of Old Town to exercise powers of
18 eminent domain against the University for that parcel
19 of land being described as follows:

20 Beginning at a point on the southerly sideline of
21 a gravel road running east and west, northerly of the
22 Civil Defense Bunker Building, now Penobscot County
23 Women's Prison Facility, which point is located 220
24 feet westerly of the westerly line of the Civil
25 Defense Bunker Building; which point is marked by a
26 6-inch poplar with black and pink flagging; thence
27 southerly at about right angles to the gravel road 803
28 feet, more or less, to a point marked by a 5-inch
29 poplar marked with black and pink flagging; thence
30 westerly approximately parallel to the gravel road
31 1,240 feet, more or less, to a point marked by a
32 painted arrow located 75 feet north of a flagged
33 hemlock tree; thence north 775 feet to a 6-foot
34 aluminum stake with pink and black flagging located on
35 the southerly sideline of the gravel road; thence
36 easterly along the southerly sideline of the gravel
37 road 1,131 feet, more or less, to the point of
38 beginning. The lot consists of 21.7 acres.
