- 1. Elderly households. Beginning March 1, 1989, and annually thereafter, the State Tax Assessor shall determine the household income eligibility adjustment factor. That factor shall be multiplied by the income limitations in section sections 6206 and 6207, applicable for the year prior to that for which relief is requested. The result shall be rounded to the nearest \$100 and shall apply to the year for which relief is requested corresponding to the year on which the annualized cost of living cost-of-living adjustments were based.

25 FISCAL NOTE

This amendment ties eligibility for the elderly low-cost drug program to the household tax and rent refund eligibility requirements. This will result in an additional 7,200 eligible individuals at an estimated cost of \$110 each, for a total cost of \$792,000. There is also a potential future cost to the extent that the change to a Consumer Price Index adjustment exceeds the current income eligibility adjustment factor.'

This amendment ties the eligibilty for low-cost drugs to the household tax and rent refund eligibility standards, requires the standards to be indexed to the percent change in the Consumer Price Index and adds a fiscal note. These new income eligibility standards are \$7,400 for single member elderly households and \$9,200 for elderly households with 2 or more members.
